This funding will be used to

- Enhance the positive workplace and learning culture of the college that results in a decrease in student disciplinary absences of 5% per annum.
- Improve college students' mastery of curriculum achievement standards as demonstrated by improved performance in school-based (A-C achievement) and systemic assessments (NAPLAN Upper 2 bands, National Minimum Standards and Queensland Certificate of Education attainment).
- Ensure that 100% of college students meet National Minimum Standards in Reading with any students not meeting the benchmark having a current Individual Curriculum Plan.

Our initiatives include


- Sustaining a collaboratively agreed Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) culture across the college through supporting all staff to model and explicitly teach expectations that lead to high quality student behaviours being rewarded.
- Implementing the college Curriculum and Pedagogy plans with consistency and fidelity with reference to the research of Lyn Sharratt and Anita Archer.
- Consistently delivering the college's Reading Framework in every classroom from preparatory year to year twelve.
- Supporting college implementation of AIP priorities through the provision of additional targeted roles to achieve increased organisational effectiveness.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employing teacher specialists to enact PBL initiatives inclusive of student engagement strategies - \$130,000
- Employing student support team members including Speech Language Pathologists and Chaplain - \$85,000
- Providing additional management support to enhance student wellbeing in junior secondary - \$180,000
- Fostering community engagement to support the college volunteer reading program - \$25,000
- Employing additional leadership team members including Junior School Deputy Principal (0.5) and Head of Department (Curriculum) \$200,000
- Employing additional junior school curriculum support and secondary school teaching staff to support student learning improvement - \$179,328
